




So come to Algarve, anytime of the year... And be sure to include Lisbon in your itinerary. You will find this historic city a rewarding experience and the «ambience» exceptional in all respects.

# ALGARVE

A Corner of Europe — The maritime province of the Algarve stretches along the hundred miles of southern Portugal, and forms the Southwest corner of Europe. For a long time a remote and rugged range of mountains cut off the Algarve from not only the rest of Portugal, but from Europe itself. As a result the province and the people developed a character distinctly their own, part oriental, part European. And though the land is now accessible to all, the magic and the spirit of the past prevail.

South of the mountains lies one of the most exciting and unspoilt coastlines in the world. From pale beaches, fantastic yellow rocks twist and burst towards a blue sky which melts indefinably into the sea. Brilliantly white houses cluster together to form fishing villages, and here and there the beguiling shape of a Moorish building catches the eye.

Tourist development of the area has been controlled by the Government permitting only first class projects. It is an extraordinary experiment to control a whole coastline, but so far it has worked. The Algarve has kept its peace and quiet, still smells of lemon trees rather than diesel, still wraps you in lethargic sensuousness that makes the outside world seem not only irrelevant but almost obscene.

The Garden of Portugal — Spring in the Algarve starts in January with the blossom of almond trees, and Summer never really ends.

Lemons, oranges, carobs, pomegranates and figs grow heavily ripe in the warm sun. And throughout the year unfamiliar and beautiful flowers bedazzle and intoxicate with their colour and their scent. But above all, the almond blossom, as white as snow, covers vast areas of the Algarve like a bride's veil. Every village on the coast is devoted to fishing, for it is the Province's main industry. The types of fish are as innumerable as the methods of their preparation; Mullet, Sardine, Sword fish, Razor fish, Tunny, Turbot, Cod, Crab, Lobster and Clam to name but a few. At Tavira the Tunny fishing is an unforgettable spectacle, the fishermen in their Phoenecian like boats encircle shoals of the fish, and then leap into the sea to haul those huge creatures, still fighting, aboard.

The People and Their Pastimes — Fisherfolk the world over share special traits of character. The nature of their lives, perpetually matched against the elements, instils in them a steadfastness, a courage and an aptitude for philosophising that is both unique and attractive. To this the people of the Algarve add their own ingenuous charm. They have that rare quality of spontaneous friendliness, and their generosity is overwhelming. Their Moorish ancestry can often be detected in lean and alert faces with piercing eyes. Generally dressed in black, they are a dramatic contrast to their surroundings, but many villagers embroider their dresses with flowers or wear one tucked in the brim of their hat.

The Portuguese are a hardworking race. In the Algarve they relax with music and dancing, which are as distinctive as the people. The music, the «Corridinho» is played on a type of accordion, and is fast and strident, with an extremely catching rhythm, even for the uninitiated. On feast days, when the villages have their fairs, everybody is expected to join in the gay whirling dances in the streets and squares, with flowers used for ammunition. The pure fun and gaiety of a feast day in the Algarve, is something to see and appreciate. These are the days to buy the local wares; beautifully coloured tiles, articles made of cork, esparto grass plaited into handsome mats, baskets and bags, shining pink copper pans and pots, earthenware pitchers and braziers, and delectable sweets in the shapes of animals and flowers made from almonds figs and eggs.

The Climate — A land where swimming in the sea is as delightful in November as it is on Midsummer Day has every claim to being idyllic.

In the summer the heat of the sun, which might otherwise be intolerable, is cooled by refreshing Atlantic breezes, and in the Winter, the temperature of the sea rarely falls below 59.° F. The Algarve

enjoys a delightful climate throughout the year, but its effect is best in the early Spring, for then the Algarve is an explosion of colours and warmth, blue skies, sea and flowers.

The climate of the Algarve is excellent, without the extreme heat and cold found elsewhere in Europe. Figures for air and sea temperatures, rainfall, and hours of sunshine compare most favourably with other coastal resorts in the world.

Places to stay — Accommodation along the Algarve is increasing year by year as new hotels are built, and the range is very wide. From luxury international hotels to furnished apartments, from villas to the excellent «Pousada» (State built, but privately run small hotels, maximum stay 5 days) to the simplest Pensions (Boarding houses) prices are extraordinarily low when compared with many other European resorts.

Wining and Dining — Most of the larger villages and towns have restaurants and night clubs, «discotecs», «Boîtes», which are independent of the hotels. The emphasis of food in the Algarve is, not surprisingly, on fish and even the most experienced gourmet is likely to be pleasantly surprised by the excellence and infinite variety of his meals. There are international menus, of course, though they are generally passed over for local dishes. A few of these dishes are:

Sardinha Assada — fresh grilled sardine, eaten straight from the charcoal grill with a salad and washed down with ample sips of strong red wine. Caldeirada — A chowder of several species of fish, shellfish, potatoes and tomatoes, flavoured with onion, garlic, malagueta and «pimento». Connoisseurs prefer the Caldeirada stewed in seawater. Cataplana — is, in fact, the name of the special vessel in which clams and meat are cooked together. This is a double pan which operates as a primitive pressure pan. The ordinary Cataplana is made with clams, ham and sausage of the Portuguese type, flavoured with onions, malaguetas and paprika.

Night Life — The night clubs, discotecs and «boîtes» run the gauntlet in décor, sophistication, simplicity, gaiety and real swinging spots. A pleasant way of spending a relaxed evening is to sit outside a café, for the nights are warm, and sip liqueurs and wines.

Apart from the traditional Portuguese table wines, ports and brandies, the Algarve produces its own wines, mainly from the Lagoa area. These are rosé, red and white and are highly distinctive.

An unusual brandy which should be tried is the «aguardente de medronho», and as an aperitif «Afonso III», a light, dry wine, is most

pleasant.

Castro Marim

Festivals — The Algarveans are no less devoutly Catholic than their fellow countrymen. Thought of a religious festival without dances, singing, fireworks and processions, would be incredible to them. If a visitor is fortunate enough to be in the right place at the right time he will be impressed by the decorations with which the whole festive village is adorned. He will be moved too, by the contrast between the irresistible, almost childish excitement and the villagers' intense piety. # Sports

Fishing — Fish and Shellfish are one of the main riches of Algarve and fishing is worth watching owing to its picturesque aspects.

Visitors wishing to take part in fishing along the coast, which is carried on all the year round, should make arrangements with hotel managements or the local Tourist Offices. The coast of Algarve is also excellent for angling and under-water fishing because of the wide variety and number of existing species. In the opinion of some sportsmen, some of the best fishing grounds in Europe are to be found in the Algarve, (Sagres and Carrapateira).

The following types of fish and shelfish may be found here in great quantity: Grey Mullet, Bluefish, Red Bream, Porgie Bream, Conger Eel, Red Mullet, Moray Eel, Stone Bass, Scabbard Fish, Albacore, Golden Bream, Salmon Bass, Claucous Bass, Bonito, Tope, Broadbill, Swordfish, Meagre, Tunny, Comber, Sole, Lobster, Crab, Goose Barnacles, Mussels, Clams and Shrimps.

Golf - Three of the most magnificent championhip 18-hole

golf courses in Europe are located along the Algarve. They were specially designed by top golf architects; Frank Pennick and Henry Cotton. The courses are in excellent condition with well-kept greens and most interesting fairways, and are located in exceptionally picturesque areas.

Vale de Lobo Golf — 15 Kms from the Faro airport. Has very good club house facilities with a very friendly atmosphere. The course is set in amongst the umbrella pine trees which cover the rolling hill sides, offering magnificent sea views.

Vilamoura Golf — 18 Kms from the Faro airport. Has a very spacious and beautifully decorated club house. The course is built in a heavily umbrella pine covered area with a backdrop of scenic beauty.

Penina Golf — 70 Kms from the Faro airport (a new air strip for light planes from Lisbon or Faro will soon be open). Has very good club house facilities located in the hotel. This course is located in a very lush green valley, and is most challenging.

Each year in mid-March the Algarve championship is played at one of the above courses. This tournament is the start of the European circuit. In 1970 it will be at Vilamoura, 1971 Vale do Lobo, 1972 Penina Golf.

With this selection of wonderful golfing facilities, it would be difficult to beat the Algarve for a golfing holiday. Golf clubs are available at reasonable rental charges.

Hunting — Algarve does not have a great variety of game although rabbits, partridge and wild pigeon (rock doves) can be found. Rabbits and partridge can be found mostly at Sagres, Foia and in the «Serra Zone».

The following dates will be of interest to sportsmen:

August 15 — The season opens for birds of passage.

October 15 to January 15 - Open season for all game.

Riding - The two horseback riding centres, Vilamoura and

Penina Golf, are beautifully located with the very best of facilities.

Tennis - Tennis courts are located throughout the Algarve.

Water Sports — Swimming, skiing, boating, sailing and skin-diving.

# Shopping

Copper and Brass. Wide selection of fine quality and distinctive ware.

Cork Carvings. Many interesting and attractive pieces.

Embroidery. Madeira lace is synonymous with the best embroidery in the world. Although the main source is from Madeira Island, good selections are available in the Algarve.

Esparto Grass. Plaited into handsome mats, baskets and bags.

Filigree Jewellery. The art of making this filigree jewellery is an hereditary industry and somewhat special to the Portuguese craftsmen for centuries. Small gold articles like pins, bracelets and brooches are remarkably inexpensive.

Marble. Is reasonably cheap and in good supply here in the Algarve. Polished ashtrays and vases as well as table

tops etc. Prices are very reasonable.

Port Wine. Port Wine is mainly from the North but obviously a pleasant choice is always available in the Algarve. Even the most ordinary little wine store can offer you a fine Port. White Port, served chilled, is very popular out here and served this way as an «aperitif», the darker red Ports are very popular too and can be obtained for as little as 40\$00 per bottle or 1.40 U. S. or 12/6d

Tiles and Pottery. Portugal is famous for beautifully coloured patterned ceramic tiles, and there is a large variety of distinctive Portuguese earthenware and pottery.

# Transportation

Since the opening of the International Jet airport at Faro, the journey by air (30 minutes) from Lisbon to the Algarve has become very easy. There are also scheduled international flights into the Algarve From Dusseldorf, Frankfurt, London and Lisbon. In addition, there are daily rail services from Lisbon, of which two are express trains (Ferry boat from Terreio do Paço Lisbon to Barreiro and from there by train). There are daily coach services from Barreiro and Cacilhas (7 hours). Cars can be hired in Lisbon (self-drive or chauffeur driven) either through car hire firms or through the airlines (a 4-5 hour drive). Bus and car rental services (International car rental as well as local Co's) are readily available.

Places to see — Between Cape St. Vincent in the West to Monte Gordo in the East, there are dozens of fishing villages and small towns whose histories are visible in the variety of architecture; staggering views and endless beaches, occasionally broken up by secluded coves that emerge at every turning of the road.

Throughout the Algarve sightseeing tours can be arranged for you through your place of lodging or at the local tourist office.

# Language

All

English is spoken quite extensively throughout the Algarve, also a good bit of French and Spanish.

Portuguese is a difficult language; however, one should not have too much trouble picking up a few words like: Bom dia — Good morning, Boa tarde — Good afternoon, Boa noite — Good evening and Goodnight, Obrigado — Thank you (women say — Obrigada, the feminine ending).

# Tourist Information

There are government tourist offices located all along the coastal area staffed with English-speaking receptionists. Here colourful and informative travel folders are available for the asking.

Visas are not necessary for the American or English — on arrival the U.S. and English visitor is given a passport stamp valid for 2 months at no charge. To have this extended, the hotel porter will send your passport to the proper office.

The Portuguese like the tourist and go all out to please them. They are exceptionally pleasant and courteous people to be in contact with and often personally lead the way when asked for directions.

# Money and prices

The monetary units are the centavo and escudo. The largest coin is 50\$00 escudos. The method of writing the dollar sign is after the escudo and before the centavo, so at first sight prices on a menu can be misleading.

One U.S. dollar is equal to 28\$50 escudos. One English pound is equal to 68\$50. These rates can fluctuate slightly, check with hotel porter or a local bank.

\$2.50 U. S., or 13/-to £1. ster.

8. Any of the five hotels, Dona Filipa, Balaia, Algarve, Alvor Praia and Penina Golf have exchange eating arrangements and will serve a full pension (board) luncheon or dinner in their main restaurant. The exchange eating tickets are obtained at the hotel reception desk.

- It is quite common to ask for a lunch (picnic) box at your hotel for beach trips, etc. Water is drinkable anywhere in Portugal.
- Reductions Children under 8 years of age must be granted a discount of 50%.
  - (a) On the price of lodging for one person, when such children occupy the same room as the persons accompanying them.
  - (b) On the price of meals and food service.
- 11. Tipping Taxes All hotel-restaurant and other tourist prices are taxed with a 10% service charge (it is customary to give an additional 5% to 10% tip depending on the quality of service), and 3% which is a Government tourist tax. During the off season, November through February, room rates are 15% lower, as a rule. All coffee places charge 16% service.
- 12. Other Accommodation Apartments, villa type houses and houses fully furnished run from \$25.00 to \$40.00, £10.11.0 to £16.14.0 and 705\$00 to 1.120\$00 a month during the low season and from \$90.00 to \$150.00, £37.16.0 to £61.0.0 and 2.565\$00 to 4.275\$00 during the high season. They are available in all the places listed in this folder. For information contact the Tourist Office of Portugal, Praça dos Restauradores, Lisbon or contact local Travel Agent offices along the Algarve.





The Caldas (once an old Roman Spa) are mineral springs bubbling up from the ground in a Valley which is highly productive in apples, pears, grapefruit. Flowers are in abundance: camelias, rhododendron, dog roses and strange forest companions like banana palms and arbutas, walnut trees and mimosa. Something is always in bloom. When the Summer sun broils the beaches a few miles away, cool breezes enable you to relax, strolling beside water falls along shaded walks or ride a donkey (without too much difficulty it is possible to arrange a donkey tour with as many as 20 donkeys) at about 80\$50 — \$2.50 — £1.1.0 each person.



Fishing — for those who want to do deep sea fishing, there is Willem Persoon, a friendly Dutchman, who has his headquarters, International Sports Center, an attractively-designed building, complete with an interesting boutique (store) and a Bar (O Batador) filled with pictures of big sea catches. Here negotiations can be made for your adventurous fishing expedition.

A fishing boat complete with all tackle and bait, for four persons runs around \$36,00, £15 or 1.000\$00 a day. Sagres and Carrapateira (16 Kms. to the North) as well as the beaches of Monte dos Clerigos and Arrifana are considered by sportsmen to be the best fishing grounds in Portugal and among the best in Europe. The ideal season for angling is from the beginning of October to mid-January, for there is no wind and according to the fishermen, this is when there are better opportunities. Shore fishing — Moray Eel, Grey Mullet, Scabbard Fish, Bluefish, Bass, Glaucous Bream and Tope. Deep Sea Fishing — Sharks — Blue, Mako and Hammerhead, Swordfish, Rod and Line — Tunny, Swordfish, Meagre, Tope, Scabbard Fish, Stone Bass and Conger Eel.

In the depths varying between 44 and 660 metres (20 and 300 fathoms) Red Bream, Golden Bream, Bass, Grey Bream, Grey Mullet, Moray Eel, Bream, Bluefish, Comber, Albacore, Bonito and Big-Eyed Bream, Inshore fishing — Sole, Red Mullet, Pandora Bream, Pout and Small Saurel.

Specialized Fishing — Shellfish, Lobster Crawfish, Crab, Goose Barnacles and Mussels, are considered the best of all the Portuguese coast especially the Lobster. Bait — Fresh bait for all kinds of fishing is found in this zone.

Underwater Swimming — with water temperature seldom dropping below 59.°F (15.°C) in Winter and rising to 70.°F (21.°C) in Summer, is superb. It would probably not be an exaggeration to say that in many aspects, this is one of the most perfect areas in Europe for the practice of this fascinating sport. Particularly in the Sou-

thern area of Cape St. Vincent the rock formation is quite fantastic with under-sea life so abundant that it is more in the nature of an aquarium than the open sea. It is truly an experience which should not be missed.

Shooting — Rabbit, Partridge and Hare, wild pigeon and duck. Then, of course, there is swimming, water skiing and sailing.

### Sightseeing

At the fort of Sagres, there are the ruins of the fort to see, gun emplacements and old cannons. Also, on request, historical films will be shown. Here again, the road takes you close to the edge of the cliffs, giving a thrilling view of the sea pounding away hundreds of feet below; men fishing from these heights look like puppets in action with no fear of their lives as they perch dangerously along the cliff's edges. As this is the principal lobster fishing area for the Algarve, there are the lobster fishing boats to watch as they come back to their port, the Bay of Sagres.

#### CAPE ST. VINCENT

Is the Southwestern tip of Europe. Two hundred feet beneath it, the mighty Atlantic thunders, and from it can be seen endless succession of ships making their way to and from such places as Istambul and Leningrad, London and Bombay, Hamburg and Hobart. Three miles away is the village of Sagres.

(125 Kms. from Faro Airport)

Accommodation — There are no hotels, etc., here.

Restaurants — A short distance from the Light House on the road to and from the Cape, there is the «FORTE BELICHE» where tea, coffee and snacks are served (in season.) The restaurant, which is in

the middle of the old Fort perched close to the cliff's edge, is most interesting.

Sports - Fishing from the cliffs.

Sightseeing — A tour of the Lighthouse is a must. The more recently built and the old buildings show a definite contrast in architecture. The Light itself is the strongest in all Europe, throwing its light 60 miles out to sea.

A strange sight to observe as one drives very close to the cliffs, are the local fishermen casting their long lines out over the cliff's edge. Some even carry ropes and lower themselves down to more advantageous but dangerously located ledges.

Entertainment — None organised.

FARO - EAST

#### S. BRAS DE ALPORTEL

Northeast of Loulé, set high over magnificent scenery is the charming village of S. Brás de Alportel. It has one of these infallibly excellent «Pousadas».

This and the fish market make the village a favourite with painters, as well as with less industrious visitors.

#### NEAR BYE VILLAGES TO VISIT

#### FUSETA

Six miles farther East, this is somewhat similar to Olhão, but on a smaller scale; the bathing is rather better.

Not far from Olhão are two interesting places, both of which are set in superbly beautiful country:—

#### MILREU - ESTOI

Milreu — There are the remains of Roman baths and some attractive mosaics. An ancient building is reputed to be a 3rd Century Christian Church, which would make it one of the earliest in the World. The palace and formal park with fountains of ESTOI, are well worth visiting.

#### TAVIRA

Famous for its tunny fishing and sardines, it is cut off from the sea by a long spit of sand and is built on both banks of the river Gilão. From the ruined castle on the West bank, there is a fine view of the flat-roofed town with its weird chimneys and minarets. South-west of the town at the tiny village of Santa Luzia, there is an excellent beach.

#### TAVIRA - PRAIA DE MONTE GORDO

#### PRAIA DE MONTE GORDO

Near the mouth of the River Guadiana, lies one of the most delightful and unusual beaches in the Province, for at Praia de Monte Gordo, the exquisitely perfumed pine trees reach the pale gold sand by the water's edge. From the twelfth century castle at Castro Marim, the Spanish frontier can be seen. The town itself is attractive.
